☐ The definite article

Arabic language doesn't have an indefinite noun (a or an) but it has the definite article U (the)

Examples

a book	- كِتَابْ
the book	الْكِتَابْ
a girl	- بِنْتُ
the girl	الْبِنْتُ
a pen	- قَلَمْ
the pen	الْقَلَمُ
a boy	- وَلَدُّ
the boy	الْوَلَدُ

الحُروفُ الشَّمْسَيَّةُ Sun letters

It means that we don't pronounce the () in the definite article(ال) , and to pronounce the letter after (J) twice

Examples:



shamsun

Ashshamsu



ragulun

arragulu



Talebun attalebu

Moon letter الحُروفُ القَمَرَيَّةُ - ح - ح - خ - أ - ب - ج - ح - خ - ي - ف - ق - ك - م - و- ه - ع - غ - أ - ب - ج - ح - خ

Letter (J) is pronounced after those 14 letters

Examples:



qamarun alqamaru

. قَمَرُّ الْقَمَّ



babun albabu

- بَابُّ الْبَابُ



bintun albintu - بِنْتُ الْبِنْتُ
