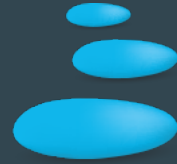

Shaddah (ّ)

is a symbol that means to double the letter (in pronunciation)

Examples

sayyara سَيَّارَةٌ

qetta قَطَّةٌ

Sokoon (◌ْ)

When Sokoon occurs it means there is no vowel, it is equal to a stop

Examples

bintoun بِنْتُ

korsioun كُرْسِيٌّ

Tanween

Nunnation, it is to pronounce (n) at the end of the word. Tanween is only used with indefinite singular noun, or feminine indefinite noun

It can be

و - = - =

Examples

كِتَابٌ

كِتَابٍ

كِتَابًا

shokran شُكْرًا

gedan جِدًّا

kathiran كَثِيرًا

Hamza

the glottal stop (ء)

(ء) is used with the three long vowels
or by itself

Examples

أ - أَمِيرٌ
وُ - لُؤْلُؤٌ
يُ - جَرِيٌّ - مِئَةٌ
ء - مَسَاءٌ

Note that

When ل is used together with ا it is
written this way, لا

Examples for going letters
